314.0	TO CONSIDER AND COMMENT ON PLANNING MATTERS	
314.1	Applications submitted to HDC:	
	a) <u>41a Main Street, Medbourne</u>	
	A discussion was had on the new property for.	
	A report on a survey from the British Geological Society has not indicated that the ground presents a risk in terms of the degree of the slope (it is @5 degrees, and concern is stated to start at 10 degrees of angle). The site is outside the 'zone of instability' shown in Neighbourhood Plan, and though the Plan advised on a	

	use for the site <i>without</i> this kind of building development, it could accept one more building as a 'windfall' for housing supply.	
	Local residents living below the site have continued to express strong concern about the impacts on future potential 'water run-off' from extra buildings in this area, and point to evidence of steady and increased flooding since 1990's.	
	<b>Recommendation :</b> It was noted that this is likely to be considered by HDC Planning Committee on 4 December. PC Councillors agreed not make comments in opposition to the application, but to return comment to HDC that the concerns about potential flooding and water run-off should be seriously considered. 	b) <u>18/01518/LBC – link extension, The Old House, 10 Old Green</u>	
	A statement from the applicant was read to the meeting concerning the considerations being given to historic elements of the property. The P.C. discussed the views of councillors regarding the proposed extension, possible objections and possible advantages of parts of the scheme.	
	It was noted by councillors that the site of the property is not particularly prominent within the conservation area of the village, and the proposed scheme would make barely perceptible changes to the village street-scene.	
	Public support was commented upon in the meeting, and indicated for the application as it stands.	
	Recommendation : to support the application as is.	
	c) Home Farm, Holt Road, Medbourne.	
	There had been a site visit made by PC Councillors to consider the site and the application for a new barn. No objections to the proposals had been raised, providing that suitable future tree screening is put into place.	
	<b>Recommendation :</b> to return support for the application as it is, but to emphasise adherence of the discussed tree screening as had been explained to PC CIIrs at time of the visit.

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315.0	TO NOTE CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED:	
315.1	A response had been received from Leics County Council Highways regarding concerns to extend local speed limit areas to 30mph and was read to the meeting. A study will be undertaken into speeding in and through the village over the next 4-6 weeks, and then LCC will inform the PC of the results.	
	It was greed to place a copy of the LCC on the village website in order to prompt residents to compile evidence and a chronology of speeding and potential accidents, and for this to be returned to LCC direct.	MF
	A further letter had also been received from Mr Denness, expanding on views of local residents for speed reduction measures and noting recent history of pedestrian incidents and abuse from speeding motorists.	
	The suggestion was aired that the PC could purchase a speed- activated 30-mph sign (in the region of @£2000 to buy and install). It was felt that this may need a clearer aspiration from the local community to demonstrate support for such a purchase from PC funds or from the future precept.	
	[The meeting was reminded of the 'speed gun' available for monitoring vehicle speeds, and the procedure and guidelines for local people to liaise with the police.]	
	It was agreed to review the situation in 4-6 weeks and to see what next contact with LCC may be required at that time.	
315.2	A circular had been received from LRALC noting its neutral position in relation to considerations of potential unitary status between Leicestershire local authorities.	
315.3	Details had been received from HAD of the likely cost of the next local authority and parish elections in 2019. Potential cost will be between $\pounds400 - 1200$ , depending on whether elections are required and if they are held in conjunction with HDC or not.
