	These were approved as drafted, with one correction to the spelling of Pagets Farm (with no 'D').	
472.0	PUBLIC REPRESENTATIONS	
472.1	There was substantial input from parish residents on the proposal for 21 new dwellings on the Hallaton Rd.Comments critical to the proposal noted that this number was significantly above hat had been supported in the Neighbourhood Plan; that such a development would encroach onto open countryside; that the dwellings would be very visible due to the	
	steepness of the site, which would also endanger soil stability in future; and that there may be disruption to valuable archaeological remains.	
472.2	It was noted that there may be a site visit during the week by HDC, but there would be no obligation to inform the PC.	
473.0	CLERK & COUNCILLORS REPORTS	
473.1	A short report was noted from the Trees and Brook Warden on the current condition of village trees.	
473.2	An acknowledgment was made on the extent of campaigns elsewhere to enhance wildflowers on grass verges, and it was	

	agreed that Councillors look around the village for possible verges that could become exemplars for wildflower growth.	
473.3	MF noted that the planned policy reviews had commenced on this agenda. A review of PC assets would be undertaken once all polices had been reviewed.	
473.4	All other actions had been undertaken by MF as per minutes.	
474.0	TO RECEIVE REPORTS ON THE FOLLOWING MATTERS:	
474.1	Village Hall No meeting recently. Routine insurance is in place for the Hall.	
474.2	MEFT A donation of £665.50 had been received from the BBQ and was being held by Cllr. P. It had been hoped this could be for new swing provision, but costs would be much higher than the donation sum, so other ideas were being considered.	
474.3	Sports Club The recent good weather had enabled the 6-a-side event and the monthly luncheons to be well supported.	
474.4	Village broadband and website No detail to report.	
475.0	TO CONSIDER AND COMMENT ON PLANNING MATTERS	
475.1	Applications submitted to HDC:	
475.1.1	19/01274/OUT - Hallaton Rd Site (21 new dwellings) Consideration was given to a comparison of the site recorded in the NP and the larger site now included in the planning application.	
	The NP recommended 12 units as a minimum with 40 % as affordable housing provision, but it appeared that the application had significantly increased the total number of properties, did not include enough affordable provision and did not include sufficient smaller units.	
	It was agreed to submit a strong objection to the application as it stands.	
475.1.2	19/01170/FUL (creation of parking space) Three Councillors had visited the site and noted it would be useful to increase off-road parking provision. Discussion was had on needing to check the access width, and that piers should be provided to support the wall openings.	

 475.1.3 It was agreed to support the application, subject to the comment on strengthening the wall openings. 475.1.3 19/00852/FUL - 'Hinch's Farm Buildings' Agents of the applicant noted surprise at the PC's comments 	
recorded on the HDC website that the application did not seem to be in line with the NP, and that other comments had not been raised in discussion at previous PC meetings (e.g. on noise and smell and on the size of the proposed barn).	
Councillors responded that public representations had not been in favour of the application's details at the time of PC meeting and that other points only arose after the application had been finally submitted. The PC's main concern was with the closeness of potential agricultural use to domestic uses, but not to the notion of associated business uses.	
A number of points were made regarding revisions to the application, including reconsideration of the workshops and agricultural building, an increased number of smaller dwellings, plus other small economic work-units. There could be a single (unshared) access road for the dwellings, though a reduced size of scheme would probably be no longer large enough for a possible local solar-PV contribution.	
The agents asked for more guidance on what could be acceptable to the PC and to the NP- it was agreed to return to the PC with further ideas on the application.	
475.2 To note decisions undertaken by HDC: Permission had been given for tree removal by the Village School Building.	
475.3 <u>To note enforcement actions commenced by HDC</u> : None to note	
475.4 <u>Other planning matters</u> :	
Councillors noted concern on the protocol for hearing views from developers and agents, and how matters are finally considered by the PC when an application has been finally submitted.	
It was agreed that discussion about applications cannot <i>debate</i> matters but must be seen to be sufficiently <i>transparent</i> . Councillors agreed to contact LRALC / NALC for any guidance on degrees of engagement with applicants and developers.	llrP
