Medbourne Parish Council is committed to developing a Neighbourhood Plan and we have set up an Advisory Committee to help drive this forward.


We want our Neighbourhood Plan to reflect the views and aspirations of the whole Medbourne community and hope everyone will get involved and have their say.



What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

A Neighbourhood Plan is a way for our community to influence the planning of the area in which we live and work. It can be used to:

- ✓ Develop a shared vision of our neighbourhood
- ✓ Choose where new homes, shops, offices or other developments should be built
- ✓ Identify and protect local green spaces
- ✓ Influence what new buildings should look like.



What can our Plan cover?

Our Neighbourhood Plan will detail how we want Medbourne to develop over the next 15 years.

This is our opportunity to have our say over what the village is like in the future.

It is not just about where and what type of housing developments we might have but will consider, in detail, things like village facilities, transport, employment, heritage and green spaces.





What about the District Plan?

The Medbourne Neighbourhood Plan will have to recognise and reflect the developments outlined in the Harborough District Council Local Plan.

This will set out in broad terms how much and what sort of development should happen across the district. The preferred options for the HDC Local Plan should be decided soon.

Medbourne can influence where and what type of developments these are through our Neighbourhood Plan.






Our Neighbourhood Area...

About MNPAC...

The Medbourne Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Committee (MNPAC) has been set up by the Parish Council specifically for the purpose of developing our Neighbourhood Plan.

The committee is appointed by the Parish Council and comprises a group of up to 10 residents and 2 Parish Councillors.

The committee operates under the terms of reference defined by the Parish Council.

That means you and everyone else in the community.


And we really do need active community participation if we are to develop a successful Neighbourhood Plan.
